**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:** Certification to the FEL(s) listed above, as applicable, is subject to the following terms, limitations and conditions. The FEL(s) is the emission level declared by the manufacturer and serves in lieu of an emission standard for certification purposes in any averaging, banking, or trading (ABT) programs. It will be used for determining compliance of any engine in this family and compliance with such ABT programs.

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED:** For the listed vehicle models the manufacturer has submitted the materials to demonstrate certification compliance with 13 CCR 1965 (emission control labels), 13 CCR 1971 (engine manufacturer diagnostic), 13 CCR 1976(b)(1)(F) {evaporative emission standards}, 13 CCR 2035 et seq. (emission control warranty), and 13 CCR 2235 [fill pipes and openings of motor vehicle fuel tanks]. (The braces { } are for gasoline, LPG or alcohol fueled vehicles only. The brackets [ ] are for gasoline or alcohol fueled vehicles only.)

Vehicles certified under this Executive Order must conform to all applicable California emission regulations.

The Bureau of Automotive Repair will be notified by copy of this Executive Order.
