## Notice of Decision

Project Title: 2012 Amendments to Area Designations for State Ambient Air Quality Standards

Project Location: Statewide

Public Meeting Date: None requested.

Project Description:

Amendments to the California Code of Regulations, title 17, sections 60201 and 60210, designating areas of California as attainment, nonattainment, nonattainment-transitional, or unclassified for pollutants with State ambient air quality standards.

ARB is required to establish and annually review area designations for State Standards. The annual review and update of the area designations gives the public, businesses, and government, an indication of whether the health-based standards are being met. During the 2012 annual review, ARB determined that changes to the existing area designations were warranted based on evaluation of air quality data from 2008 through 2010. The amendments designate the North Coast Air Basin, Northeast Plateau Air Basin, and Ventura County in the South Central Coast Air Basin as "attainment" for PM2.5. It also re-designates Glenn County, Yolo County, and the Sacramento Valley Air Basin (SVAB) portion of Solano County to "nonattainment-transitional" for ozone, which is a nondiscretionary change that occurred by operation of law (H&SC §40925.5).
