**Executive Order G-00-028**

WHEREAS, on December 10, 1998, the Air Resources Board (the ARB or Board) conducted a public hearing to consider the adoption of emission standards and test procedures for new 2001 and later spark-ignition marine engines;

WHEREAS, following the public hearing, the Board adopted Resolution 98-63, in which the Board approved title 13, California Code of Regulations (CCR), sections 2440, 2441, 2442, 2443.1, 2443.2, 2443.3, 2444, 2445.1, 2445.2, 2446, 2447, 2448, and the incorporated California Exhaust Emission Standards and Test Procedures for 2001 Model Year and Later Spark-Ignition Marine Engines, with the modifications set forth in Appendices A and B thereto;

WHEREAS, the approved regulations were made available for public comment for a period of 30 days, with the changes to the originally proposed text clearly indicated, in accordance with the provisions of title 1, CCR, section 44;

WHEREAS, the written comments received during the subsequent 30-day comment period have been considered by the Executive Officer and did not require modification nor reconsideration by the Board of the approved regulations.

WHEREAS, additional modifications to the approved regulations were made in response to two Decisions of Disapproval by the Office of Administrative Law for the proposed adoption of section 2443.3, title 13, CCR;

WHEREAS, the modifications were made available for two additional 15-day public comment periods with the changes to the originally proposed text clearly indicated, in accordance with the provisions of title 1, CCR, section 44;

WHEREAS, the written comments received during both 15-day comment periods have been considered by the Executive Officer and do not require modification or reconsideration by the Board of approved regulations;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that section 2443.3, title 13, California Code of Regulations, is adopted as set forth in Attachment 1 hereto.
