Needs Assessment Report

- A legally-required report on the need and appropriate degree of regulation for a substance the ARB has determined to be a toxic air contaminant (Health and Safety Code Section 39665)
- Establishes the basis for any proposed air toxics control measure
- Developed with the help from the local air pollution control districts, affected sources, and the public
- Made available for public review at least 45-days prior to ARB public hearing

Elements of a Needs Assessment

- Formaldehyde sources
 - Mobile, industrial, agricultural, natural
- Physical and chemical characteristics of formaldehyde
- Consideration of past and current formaldehyde regulations
- Emissions, exposure, and risk
- Available control technologies
- Costs and feasibility of reducing formaldehyde emissions
- Alternative methods or practices for reducing exposures
- Identify recommended control measures to reduce emissions and risk
- Potential adverse health, safety, or environmental impacts of implementing ATCM
- Impact of potential ATCM's on formaldehyde emissions and risk

Enforcement Program Overview

• Objective:

- Develop a consistent, fair and appropriate method of enforcement
- Achieve anticipated emissions reductions from composite wood products produced and used in California

Scope:

- Will apply to all commercial levels in California (panel manufacturers, distributors, finished product manufacturers and retailers)
- May require segregation of California-only products

Enforcement Program Components

- Require compliance verification production to end-use
 - Raw boards, finished products
- Documentation records
 - Emissions testing large chamber; QA/QC tests
- Sample retention
- Imports
 - Raw board testing
 - Finished product testing
- Allow for auditing/testing
- Labeling requirement

Enforcement at Production Level

- Manufacturers Producers of panels and laminators
 - Product emissions testing
 - Similar to CPA certification
 - Production Documentation
 - Labeling
 - CPA Certification vs. ARB ATCM

Enforcement at Distribution Level

• Distribution facilities

- Product testing
 - Similar to CPA certification for new boards/ modified product testing methods for finished products
- Documentation
- May include labeling component
- Enforcement at distribution facilities
- Includes imports

Enforcement at End-Use Level

- End-Use retail stores, businesses who buy manufactured panels; includes finished products
 - Periodic product testing (test methods?)
 - Documentation
 - Enforcement at all retailers
