Dust from disk harrowing, and the method loosens the soil for wind blown sand and dust during Santa Ana winds.

Ice Cream trucks--old vehicles, pollution devices don't work at low speed, and the vehicles stink. Perfect candidates for electrification. Operate exclusively in poor neighborhoods. Burning trash. Some neighbors think it's ok, even on no-burn days.

Copper wire insulation--less common, but plastic smoke is especially toxic.

Railroad locomotives--out of State jurisdiction, but it's still a major source and should be addressed.

Fireworks--sulfur smoke is especially toxic on July 4 and New Year's Eve, but can be year round.

Homeless fires. If it's just cooking fires, it's not a huge deal, but when they cause big wildfires, hundreds of thousands of people suffer--and often for weeks.

Informal restaurants, taco vendors, use grills with no pollution controls. Smoke billows, and no one says anything. But the same groups who complain about pollution from corporations affecting their kids patronize these places. They say nothing about cooking outside with wood on no-burn days or their fireworks that they love.
