**DUTIES:**

The Branch Chief will take a lead role for developing policies and implementing strategies to carry out ARB's climate change program pursuant to the Global Warming Solutions Act of 2006 (Assembly Bill (AB) 32). The duties and responsibilities of the branch currently include development of broad climate change policies for ARB; coordination of overall AB 32 progress relative to the Climate Change Scoping Plan and oversight of revisions to the Scoping Plan; implementation of the AB 32 Cost of Implementation Fee; implementation of an economy-wide program greenhouse gas emission reduction program; providing testimony, speeches, Board presentations, briefing papers, and other written or oral communications to support the climate change program, oversight of the development of communication and outreach materials; and maintenance of working relationships with external stakeholders, and local, State and federal representatives. The Branch Chief will also have responsibility for working with other Branches within SSD and other divisions within ARB to coordinate climate change activities, and maintaining communication with the Climate Action Team and other state agencies. This branch is currently part of the Office of Climate Change, which is being incorporated into the Stationary Source Division. As part of this incorporation, the duties and responsibilities of this branch are expected to evolve as the climate change program transitions into an implementation effort. In coordination with the Assistant Division Chief and the Division Chief, the successful candidate will have the opportunity to play a role in defining the ultimate duties and responsibilities of this branch.

**DESIRABLE QUALIFICATIONS:**

The most competitive candidates will have the following: excellent management, organizational, communication and interpersonal skills; prior regulatory experience; a strong scientific and technical background; the ability to meet deadlines; knowledge of ARB programs and policies, especially those related to greenhouse gases and climate change policy; planning and management experience on major projects; and the ability to effectively interact with all levels of staff within the Branch and across ARB, other government agencies, international groups, industry and other public stakeholders.
