PFC Consumer Acceptance Matrix March 9, 2005

Introduction

The Air Resources Board (ARB) PFC Consumer Acceptance Matrix specified below identifies the equipment portable fuel container manufacturers must use to comply with the Optional Consumer Acceptance Program requirements in CP-501, Certification Procedure for Portable Fuel Containers and Spill-Proof Spouts pursuant to Article 6 of Title 13 of the California Code of Regulations. This matrix identifies the type of equipment fuel tanks that are used by consumers in California and represents the diversity in size, shape, and configuration. This matrix is developed to ensure that each manufacturer wishing to obtain ARB authorization to place from one to three consumer acceptance stars on their portable fuel containers is afforded the same opportunity.

Equipment Representing Small Tanks:

Shindiawa Chain Saw 377, and

Equipment Representing Unusual Shaped Tanks:

Kawaski Generator (metal tank) GE-2200, or

General Motors 2004 Lumina Van, or
2004 Cavalier, or
Toyota 2004 RAV 4, or
Honda 2004 Civic

Equipment Representing Odd Configuration Tanks:

Honda Water Pump WX10C1
